Please use the public footpath into school from Citadel Street and do not cut across

the car-park. This is particularly dangerous as there are quite a few blind spots for drivers coming into and out of the carpark especially in relation



to small children who are not always as visible.



Please also be aware that it is not safe to leave your children in their buggies in the buggy park whilst you drop off or pick up your children. Staff in reception are not able to supervise them as they have a very

restricted view. We are currently looking at alternative options for sleeping children and will keep you posted.
