Makaton



On our INSET days in September, all staff were trained in Makaton, which is a sign and symbol system which can be used to support language development. There is lots of research to show that using signs and symbols alongside

speech really helps to support language development. In future newsletters, look out for our signs of the month so that you can join in with your children at home.

Chatter Matters



We will be running a 10 week course for some children and their parents called Chatter Matters which will aim to improve your child's communication and language skills through play, singing, stories, crafts and focus activities.
